An Outline of Events Surrounding the Letters of Paul to the Corinthians

- 1. Paul preaches at Corinth (18 months).
- 2. Paul departs, settling eventually in Ephesus; he writes his first letter to Corinth (Now lost; see 1 Cor. 5:9).
- 3. Corinthians write to Paul (1 Cor. 7: 1), and also send oral communication (1 Cor. 1:11 and 16:17).
- 4. Paul writes his second letter (our 1 Cor.), answering both the oral and written communications from Corinth.
- 5. He sends Timothy by land with oral instructions. Timothy returns to Ephesus, reporting that the the letter (our 1 Cor.) was poor received, and that his efforts to reclaim the church for Paul were unsuccessful.
- 6. Paul makes a brief "painful" visit to Corinth (2 Cor. 2: 1-2), returning to Ephesus in humiliation (12:21).
- 7. Paul writes a harsh letter (letter number 3) "out of much affliction and anguish of heart" (2 Cor. 2:3-4, 9; 7:8-12). This letter (possibly 2 Cor. 10-13) was hand delivered by Titus.
- 8. Paul travels to Macedonia to meet Titus who brings encouraging news about the church in Corinth.
- 9. Paul dispatches Titus with his fourth letter (2 Cor. 1: 1--9:15), a letter of reconciliation.
- 10. Paul visits Corinth to receive the offering for "the poor" in Jerusalem.
