

# Manuscripts Which Contain Philippians

## **Papyrus 46 (Date: ~200 AD or ~100 AD)**

Portions contained:

1:1, 5-15,; 17-28  
1:30--2:12, 14-27;  
2:29--3:8, 10-21  
4:2-12, 14-23

## **Papyrus 16 (Date: third/forth century ~290 - 310 AD)**

Portions contained:

3:10-17, 4:2-8

## **Papyrus 61 (Date: ~700 AD)**

Portions contained:

3:5-9, 12-16

## **Uncial Manuscripts:**

*Only those which contain Philippians in-full are listed*

Sinaiticus (~350 AD) ... Alexandrian Text

Alexandranus (~400 AD) ... Alexandrian Text in Pauline Epistles, weak Byzantine in Gospels

Vaticanus (~350 AD) ... Alexandrian Text

D (500s AD) -- Greek/Latin Diglot

F (800s AD) -- Greek/Latin Diglot with the Latin being Vulgate

G (800s AD) -- Greek/Latin Diglot/interlinear Greek and Latin (Laodiceans superscription but no text)

K (800s AD) -- Includes 3rd party commentary \*Byzantine Text

L (800s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

P (800s AD) -- note, this is a Palimpsest with 14th century text written over it.

Psi (700s AD)

049 (800s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

056 (900s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

075 (900s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

0142 (900s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

0150 (800s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

0151 (800s AD) -- \*Byzantine Text

Numerous Miniscule Manuscripts contain Philippians, again mostly Byzantine but not exclusively so.
